

# NOVEMBER 2022

## Isaiah Reading Plan (Part I)

### Week 1                      Agape                      Oct. 31 - Nov. 5

- Day 1** Isaiah 1-2    *What is the purpose of God's judgment, destruction or purification? Will there be a Day of Reckoning? What does reckoning mean to you?*
- Day 2** Isaiah 3-4    *As God begins his judgment on Jerusalem and Judah can you see the evidence of God's love and his judgments? What did the cloud by day and the flaming fire by Night mean for God's people?*
- Day 3** Isaiah 5        *Do you think the people of God are rejecting his laws or his wisdom?*
- Day 4** Isaiah 6        *What happens to Isaiah when he sees himself before a holy God and how does that differ from what God's people are doing?*
- Day 5** Isaiah 7        *Why do you think Matthew 1: 22-23 brings you back to Isaiah 7:14?*
- Day 6** Isaiah 8        *How did Isaiah reaffirm his dependence on god? Isaiah 8:16-18*

### Week 2                      Promise of YHWH                      Nov. 7-12

- Day 1** Isaiah 9-10 *What are we told about the light that has come into the world? (See Jn. 3:19-20) According to Isa.10, who is behind the discipling of Israel?*
- Day 2** Isaiah 11        *Who is the "shoot that shall come forth"? In what is his delight? How does he judge? What shall he do on the earth?*
- Day 3** Isaiah 12        *What most encourages you about the promise found here?*
- Day 4** Isaiah 13 *From where does destruction come and who/what is being destroyed?*
- Day 5** Isaiah 14        *What is the promise for Israel? How does this relate to us as God's children? See Romans 9:1-8*
- Day 6** Isaiah 15-16        *Consider God's demeanor on Moab in the midst of their destruction (Isa.15:5) and the consistent hope that lies ahead (Isa. 16:5)*

### Week 3                      Justice of YHWH                      Nov. 14-19

- Day 1** Isaiah 17-18 *What things have you relied on instead of God? How does the stripping of those things draw us closer to God? 17:7-8*
- Day 2** Isaiah 19-20        *Isaiah speaks of the Egyptians turning to YHWH and God's rescue of them. How do these verses parallel the Exodus story?*
- Day 3** Isaiah 21        *Why is Isaiah so troubled in vs 3-4 by the downfall of his enemies? How does the fall of Babylon contrast to God's eternal reign?*
- Day 4** Isaiah 22        *In vs 16 and 20 we see a contrast of two stewards. (2 Kings 18:18) What things in your life has God called you to steward? Luke 12:42-48*
- Day 5** Isaiah 23        *Tyre was a key city in the world economy of that time. How do current events and global economic instability echo these laments?*
- Day 6** Isaiah 24        *God's justice is proclaimed on the spiritual rulers. How do these vs. contrast with Eph 6:12? What implications does this have for us today?*

Week 4

**Trust in YHWH**

Nov. 21- 26

- Day 1** Isaiah 25      *What is the veil that is taken away in verse 7? 2 Cor 3:16*
- Day 2** Isaiah 26      *How does the Lord establish peace for us?*
- Day 3** Isaiah 27-28      *What benefits does the “one who believes” have in 28:16-18?*
- Day 4** Isaiah 29      *What blessings come from those able to “hear words of a book”?*
- Day 5** Isaiah 30-31      *Isaiah mentions trusting in chariots and horsemen over God.  
What devices do you default to when trials come? Deut 17:16*
- Day 6** Isaiah 32      *What happens when the Spirit is poured out in vs 15? Where  
do we see the fruit of the spirit in our own lives?*

Week 5

**Presence of YHWH**

Nov. 28-Dec. 3

- Day 1** Isaiah 33      *What is God’s promise to the prideful Assyria? (Isa.33: 1) As  
God’s people are humbled (33:2-9) how does God respond?*
- Day 2** Isaiah 34-35      *Compare and contrast the destiny of the wicked and  
the righteous as described in these chapters.*
- Day 3** Isaiah 36-37      *What is King Hezekiah’s reaction to the threats of the imposing  
enemy? How did God respond to Hezekiah? How can you  
apply this in your life?*
- Day 4** Isaiah 38      *What made God change his mind from vs 1 to vs 5? 2 King 20*
- Day 5** Isaiah 39      *What were the consequences of Hezekiah’s pride? What blinds us  
from the consequences of our own actions? 2 Ch 32:24-26*
- Day 6** Isaiah 40      *What biblical character did God later highlight as the “voice in the  
wilderness” seen in vs 3? Mal 3:1, Mal 4:5, Luke 3:4-6 How can we  
do the same?*



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
